Improved product quality and performance - through the initiative of reducing or eliminating solvents, product design changes are examined and evaluated in terms of the properties valued by our customers. These are also in compliance with other directives like RoHS and REACH requirements. Development of our product is therefore directed in such a manner that the product change produces a benefit both internally by the reduction of Organic Compound emissions and also externally by improving performance in customer applications. Reduction in non-value added costs - the requirement of air emissions permitted including daily record-keeping, fees, reports, administration and consultancy, are all non-value added costs which largely remain hidden. Feng Tai's Conflict-Free Minerals Policy

Feng Tai Electronic is aware of concerns that minerals mined in conflict area in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and adjoining countries may be making their way in the electronics industry supply chain and may be fueling human rights violation and environmental degradation in the DRC regions.

From the point of view of humanitarian, Feng Tai Electronic has established the principle of not using conflict minerals as materials for its products from December 2011. (Conflict minerals: gold, tin, tantalum and tungsten produced in an inhumane manner in the DRC and its adjoining countries/regions). We are pledged to discontinue purchase of products that contain conflict minerals mined in the DRC or adjoining countries.
